If the parents will be applying for the affidavit at the Consulate, a personal appearance is required. If the parents are in the Philippines, the Affidavit of Parental Consent must be duly notarized and apostilled by the DFA/Consular Offices	
	If the applicant is 21-25 years old, submit an Affidavit of Parental Advice (with copies of parents' passports). If the parents will be applying for the affidavit at the Consulate, a personal appearance is required. If parents are in the Philippines, the Affidavit of Parental Advice must be duly notarized and apostilled by the DFA/Consular Offices	
	Couples aged <b>18 to 25</b> must attend <b>pre-marriage counseling</b> and submit a <b>certificate</b> from an authorized counselor (priest, minister, or government counselor) when applying for a marriage license
